Park it in the Library!

Did you know you can get free entry to over 200 State Parks by simply making a visit to your local library? That's right, with a valid library card you can reserve a State Parks Pass that you can loan for up to 14 days. The pass is valid for a single vehicle entry into State Parks. Who knew?! That's just one of the many benefits of having a library card.

Our local libraries in Shasta, Siskiyou, and Trinity Counties also offer a variety of resources beyond book checkout. Libraries have reading times for children, clubs for teens and seniors, and a variety of classes from how to use smartphones to support for small businesses. The Redding library even has their Create It! space where members can access a podcasting studio, use crafting supplies, and explore 3-d printers.

Of course, the main reason to visit the library is to gain access to an endless variety of books for all ages. Shasta Head Start is an advocate for utilizing local libraries for book check out and we, of course, know and share the importance of literacy



throughout all stages of life. At Shasta Head Start we also take pride in being a Raising a Reader affiliate. If you are not a part of the Raising a Reader program or are not familiar with it, it is a literacy program that allows your child to check out books each week. It is a sort of "library" checkout system straight from your classroom or Home Visitor. The goals of Raising a Reader are to get children and families excited about and taking part in early literacy, and to encourage families to visit their local libraries. If you would like to learn more about the Raising a Reader program, we encourage you to talk to your child's Teacher, Primary Caregiver or Home Visitor and sign up to take part. If you do not have a library card, we encourage you to visit the county library links below and complete an application for a library card today.

Oh...and don't forget, take advantage of those free State Parks passes! What a great resource for your family simply by visiting the library.

Over the break children will be out of their typical routine and may resist your requests, which could cause you frustration and your child to experience intense emotions. Teachers, Home Visitors and Caregivers at Shasta Head Start use many techniques to help children learn self-regulation skills. Tucker the Turtle provides a scripted story to teach young children how to calm down when they have strong feelings by tucking into their shell and taking deep breaths before producing a solution. The story also includes visuals to help children learn how to use the strategy.
