## Tips for Easing School Transitions for Young Children

It's Springtime! Spring marks the time of year we see wildflowers, bright green trees, and enjoy more daylight. Spring is also the time to start getting children ready for the end of this school year and the beginning of a new one. Smooth transitions are important, especially for young children, and the more we can do to support them the better. Below are some tips that can help ease the transition from one school year to the next. These tips are helpful for children from infancy on up, because even our babies have transitions.

- Read books about preschool or kindergarten
- Talk about the transition in a positive way, especially in front of your child
- Tell your child stories or show pictures of yourself in your young school days
- Once you know where your child will attend next year, arrange to visit the classroom and meet the teacher, if possible
- If your child is off to kindergarten, drive by the school, talk about how they will get to school, show them where their classroom will be
- Take advantage of your child's Individual Transition Plan (from your parent/teacher conference) by using the ideas and activities to help prepare your child
